Back in Action, FACE TO FACE

After a year off because of COVID restrictions, the PHCC Educational Foundation's Plumbing and HVAC Apprentice Contests were back this past October at PHCCCONNECT2021 in Kansas City, Missouri. These contests not only give young professionals a priceless opportunity to showcase their skills on a national stage, but they also allow CONNECT attendees to see the next generation of workers in action. Nothing compares to this in-person experience!

Plumbing Apprentice Contest Winners

- First place: Garrett Boylan from Wolff's Plumbing & Heating, Inc. in Spearfish, South Dakota. He was sponsored by RIDGID.

The Challenge This Year

The plumbing apprentices were required to rough-in a bathroom system. The set-up included a toilet, sink and shower, complete with supply, waste and vent lines, plus cleanouts and extra features designed to test the contestants' knowledge and skills. The test set-up included a variety of pipe materials — cast iron, copper, PVC and PEX, and corresponding joining methods.

The HVAC competitors were required to complete a written test, demonstrate proper brazing techniques and perform a hands-on diagnostic on an HVAC package unit, with system errors created by the Foundation's contractor volunteers for the competition. The competitors also had to perform a pressure and leak test and demonstrate proper refrigerant recovery procedures and the ability to accurately take a variety of instrument readings.



The People Making It Possible

A dedicated team of contractor volunteers arrive two days before the competitions to assemble the competitor test benches, distribute the materials and supplies, and set up the testing areas. They monitor the competitions, evaluate the apprentices' work and provide constructive feedback on each competitor's performance following the event.

The contests are made possible by the generous support of several industry sponsors who provide monetary support

Milwaukee Tool made a major contribution to the Apprentice Contests again this year by donating most of the tools needed by the contestants for the competition. This gift allowed the competitors to skip the trouble of shipping their own tools and to go home with a new set of tools to power their work long after the competition ended.

"It is incredible what this team of volunteers, sponsors and staff can pull together for these contests. Even with supply disruptions and other challenges of getting all the contest materials here, everything was ready to go for the apprentices when they arrived," said Foundation Chair Kevin Tindall. "The contests are a huge part of CONNECT and a special moment for the apprentices competing. Having our first-ever female winner of the HVAC contest made this year even more special. My congratulations to everyone involved for creating a great experience for the apprentices as we returned to an in-person event this year."



Scholarship Winner Named Best of the Best

This year's HVAC Apprentice Contest winner, Karin Dahlin, is no stranger to the Foundation. In 2017, Karin applied for a Foundation scholarship and received a \$2,500 award, which helped to fund her HVAC studies at Minneapolis Community and Technical College.

On her winning scholarship application, she stated: "I hope to one day become a leader in reaching out to and welcoming new technicians to the industry, especially nontraditional technicians like myself. I feel that one key to addressing our skilled labor shortage is to change our idea of what an HVACR technician looks like. When I began considering HVACR as a trade, I had the opportunity to talk with a woman HVACR technician; this gave me the confidence I needed to take the leap. I hope to one day provide that same support and encouragement to other young women exploring the trades."

Rick Nelson Thanks You, His 'Superheroes'

After switching careers multiple times — and admittedly "burning every bridge I came to" and struggling with addiction — Rick Nelson is thankfully more than six years clean and has found his calling as a plumbing apprentice at Scott McLeod Plumbing in Rancho Cucamonga, California.

As the sole provider for a household of six, he knew he couldn't afford the tuition or books for the PHCC apprentice program he was enrolled in. "I almost had to drop out," he says.

Thankfully a contact at PHCC of Orange County, Riverside and San Bernadino (PHCC-ORSB) turned him on to applying for one of the Foundation's scholarships. As a 2021 recipient, "I don't have to give up anything to get the knowledge and training for the trade that I truly love," he says. "I would like to give the [Foundation's] donors a big hug for making it possible to be where I am in my life today. What was holding me back was having the funds to move forward in my career and in my life, and they made it possible. They are true superheroes."



Jet Thurman
Sometimes all it takes
is a 'spark.'

Jamie (Jet) Thurman was working a retail job when a female customer, who happened to be a journeyman plumber, handed her a business card. "It sparked a conversation" that led to an interview and eventual employment at HM Plumbing in Kennesaw, Georgia. "I was trusted with a leadership position in the company and allowed the privilege to work as an apprentice and gain the skills and knowledge that have led me to where I am today," she says.

But "changing careers in adulthood when you are the sole financial supporter of your family is challenging," Thurman adds. Her employer encouraged her to apply for one of the Foundation's scholarship to help with the costs of completing PHCC's Fast Track to Service Plumbing program. Because of the donors and their generous contributions, she plans on "pursuing my passion for plumbing and making a difference in the community." As a female in the trades, "I was concerned about the support I would receive," she says. "PHCC and the members have been a wonderful source of support and encouragement."



Ben Tialino

'There are no short cuts in the military, and there are no short cuts in plumbing."

After 10 years as a U.S. Marine, Peniamina "Ben" Tialino is starting his second career, already completing PHCC-ORSB's Quick Start Program and now enrolled in its four-year apprenticeship program while working at Pristine Plumbing in Irvine, California. "This education is critical to my success in transitioning from the military to civilian life," he says.

"It is not easy for me to ask for help," Tialino admits in seeking one of the Foundation's scholarships, but — with a family to support — the scholarship "gives me the ability to further my education in the plumbing industry ... and take that next step in achieving my goal" of becoming a master plumber. "Coming with some military experience, I felt very confident in my ability to adapt to something new," he adds. "I am very grateful for this opportunity and for being selected for the PHCC scholarship."

While the PHCC Educational Foundation's application process has moved to an online system, it still takes countless hours of volunteer time from our Scholarship Committee each year. This past year, the Committee reviewed 134 applications. "Looking through and scoring applications is something I feel honored to do," says Greg Hartman, chair of the Scholarship Committee and owner of Wolff's P&H, Inc. in Spearfish, South Dakota. "It's refreshing to read about some of the applicants' achievements and the amount of accomplishments some have experienced in a short time. It's also encouraging to see the courage in some that have had loss of family members or other negative happenings and still are driven to pursue tech school or college."

Hartman credits the Foundation staff with keeping the application process "up-to-date and running smoothly" and making it as "easy as possible" for the Committee members to compile scores for each applicant. "I am definitely proud to be a small part of the scholarship selection. You almost think you know some of the applicants after reading through their applications," he says. "We definitely have some first class men and women entering our industry. That gives me great satisfaction to be able to watch that happen."

The PATH Best Chosen

Repaying the Course for Prospective P-H-C Professionals

The Foundation recently aligned our PHCC Academy course offerings – and added a new course – to move students through at the correct level in their careers to get them to be licensed professionals ... and to give the contractors who employ them effective and efficient training at a reasonable price.



Workforce Readiness

To attract more people into our essential industry, the Foundation chose to offer this course – an introduction to the p-h-c profession - free-of-charge during the pandemic. It worked! Since the onset of COVID, we've enrolled more than 1,000 students from all 50 states, as well a multiple international students.

Pre-Apprentice

This new 90-day course available at an affordable introductory rate - is designed to help students diversify their skillset as helpers and prepare them for success in a suitable Fast Track or Apprenticeship training program. With very little investment, contractors have the opportunity to see if a new hire is a good fit for elearning ... and in their company culture.

Fast Track to Service Plumbing

Comprehensive entry-level training – designed *for* contractors, by contractors -Fast Track is for employees who perform residential or commercial plumbing service and repair work. The Foundation officially launched Fast Track last year, offering it through our PHCC chapter elearning partners, just as we do our apprenticeship courses. As of November 2021, we've already enrolled more than 180 students!

Plumbing and HVACR Apprenticeship

Plumbing and HVACR 101 - 401 courses provide the required technical instruction for a four-year apprenticeship program and train apprentices as a pathway into journeyman or master plumbing licensure. These courses continue to be recognized as the gold standard in registered apprenticeship training.

Nashua, New Hampshire



Remembering Our Friend John

Last March we lost our friend and Foundation Board of Governors member John McWilliams.
